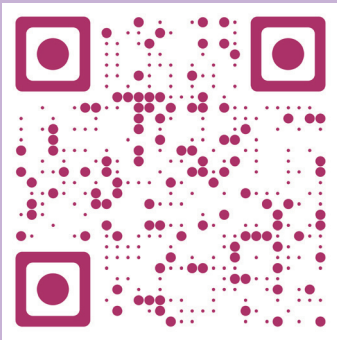


# Be Seen. Get Screened.

control of your health.



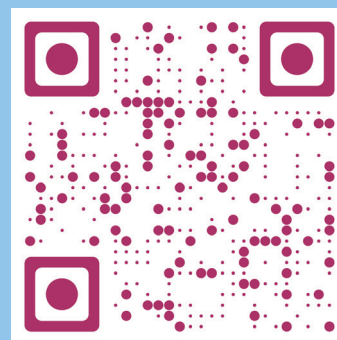

## Cancer screening is an important part of 2SLGBTQ+ health.

Have a cervix? If you're sexually active, you could be at risk for cervical cancer—regardless of who you have sex with. Talk to your healthcare provider about new HPV and cervical cancer screening options, whether you're Two-Spirit, trans, non-binary, or cisgender.



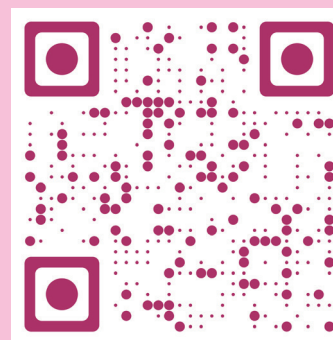

## Cancer screening is an important part of 2SLGBTQ+ health.

If you have breast/chest tissue and are over 40 years of age, you may be at risk for breast/chest cancer. Whether you are Two Spirit, trans, non-binary or cisgender, ask your healthcare provider about mammograms and cancer screening.



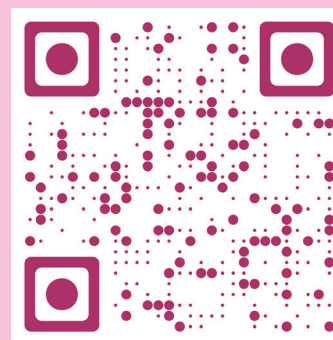
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## Cancer screening is an important part of 2SLGBTQ+ health.

Did you know that trans women taking estrogen can also be at risk for breast cancer? If you've been taking estrogen for more than 5 years and are over 40 years of age, talk to your healthcare provider about breast cancer screening.



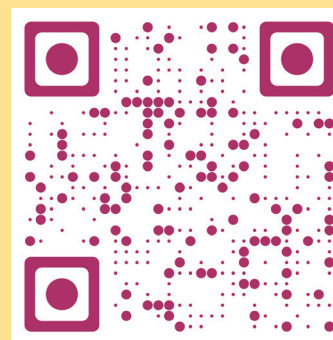

Colorectal cancer is the third most common type of cancer, but it is treatable – especially when found early. If you are over 50, talk to your healthcare provider about colorectal cancer screening.



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
